WCUI obtained provisional approval by the Arizona State Board of Nursing (AZBN), national accreditation approval by the Accrediting Commission for Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC), and Arizona state licensure approval by the Arizona State Board for Private Postsecondary Education (AZPPSE). The college is accepting applications for an anticipated July 2020 start at its new campus in Midtown Phoenix.

The WCUI Practical Nursing program is a diploma program delivered in the classroom with a team of experienced nurses, medical professionals and leaders. Our 12-month Practical Nursing diploma program aims to prepare students to become entry-level healthcare providers responsible for rendering basic nursing care. The program provides theory, technical skill, biology, pharmacology, simulation, NCLEX preparation, and off-site clinical experiences to provide the skills and competencies needed for licensure as a Practical Nurse (LPN) in the state of Arizona. Director of Nursing Catherine Jagos, MSN-Ed, BSN, RN, developed and administers the Phoenix program, bringing 40 years of clinical and education experience to WCUI.

About the College: WCUI is a private postsecondary institute headquartered in Los Angeles, CA with branch campuses in Ontario, CA and Phoenix, AZ. In July 2020, after 10 years in Phoenix, the campus will move to Park Central in Midtown Phoenix.
